

You Can Order, Dedicate Easter Lilies or Hydrangeas to Adorn the Altar

You can purchase lilies and/or hydrangeas to adorn the altar and honor loved ones on Easter Day. Dedications to your loved ones will appear in the bulletin. The cost is \$25 per lily plant and \$35 per hydrangea plant, and you are welcome to take the plants that you purchased home or donate them following the 10:15 a.m. Easter celebration worship service. The plants are in limited supply, so orders are due no later than April 6. To indicate how many lilies and/or hydrangeas you wish to purchase and to whom you would like to dedicate the plants:

- Use a yellow-bordered Easter Lily giving envelope available in the pew racks, in the narthex and on the altar flowers bulletin board in fellowship hall.
